

WHAT YOUR CHILD IS LEARNING AT CRANBROOK

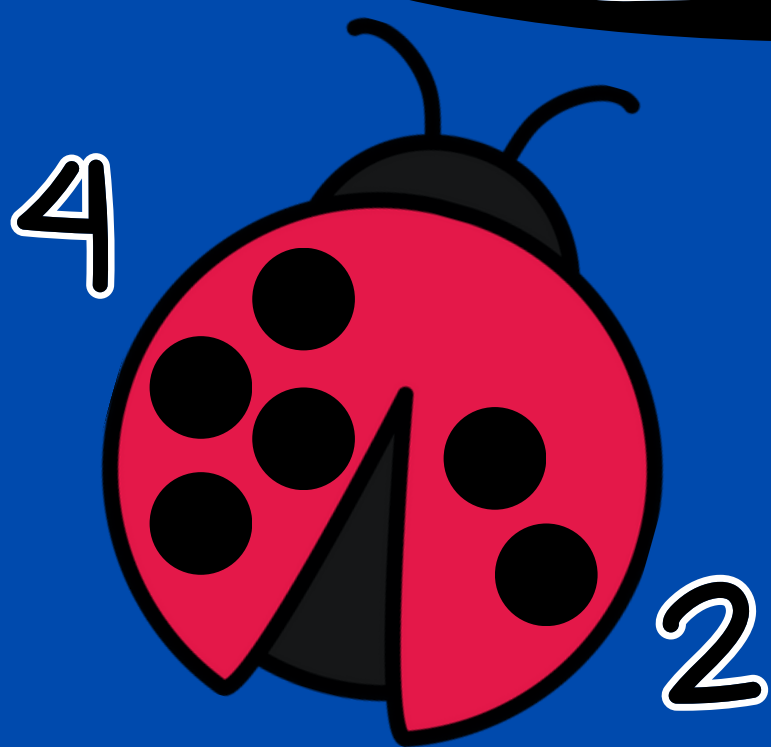
Prep. Term 4



Maths

Students will explore numbers to 20 - counting, recognising numerals and matching the numeral with a collection of objects and partitioning numbers into 2 or 3 parts. Students will sequence numbers and compare numbers to at least 20. They will also compare objects thinking about their length, mass, capacity and duration.

English

This term in English students will listen to imaginative texts, identifying the characters and events in stories. They will write a retell of an imaginative text using learnt vocabulary and phonic knowledge to spell words. They will also complete a reading task, reading a decodable imaginative text and answer comprehension questions.

InitialLit

This term students will continue to practice the letters and sounds learnt in so far this year. They will also continue to learn new digraphs sounds - where 2 letters come together to make one sound. Students will continue to practice using their sounds to blend words and read sentences.



HASS

Students will continue to explore families and investigate how different families celebrate or commemorate events such as birthdays, Christmas, Easter and family events. They will also look at how objects remind them of these events.

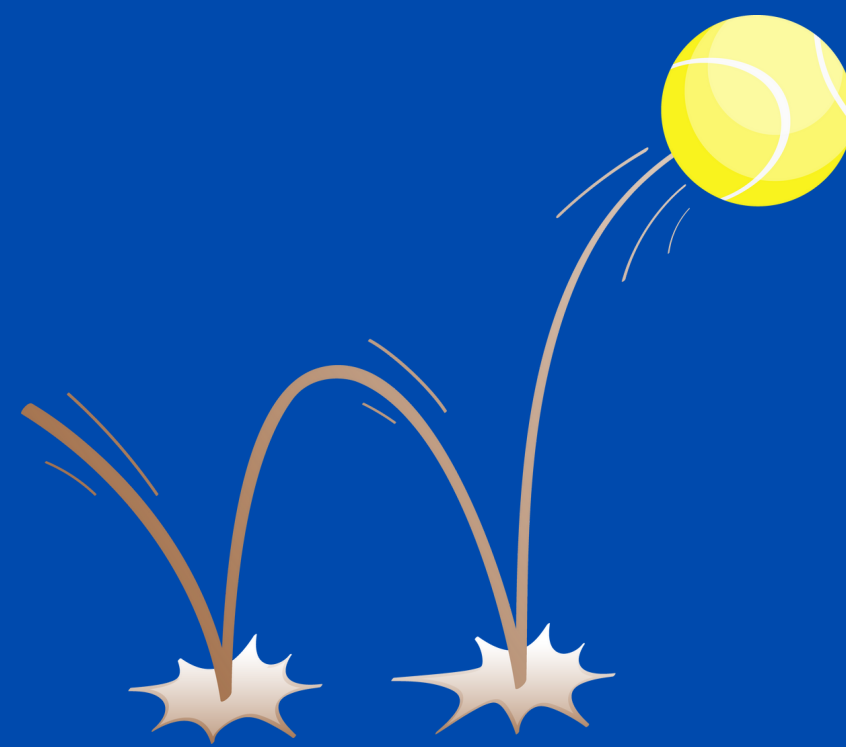
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Science

Students will look at different objects and their properties and how they move. They will engage in hands on investigations and respond to questions about the factors that affect the movement of the different objects. Students will share and reflect on their observations and ideas and draw what they observe.



The Arts

In the arts students will make and respond to music. They will sing and play instruments, improvise and practice a variety of songs and rhymes. Students will also create artworks in the style of Pete Cromer.

HPE

In Health this term students will identify actions and protective behaviours that keep them safe and healthy in situations where they may encounter medicines, poisons, water and fires.

In Physical Education students perform movement skills to music. They will describe how their body moves.
